

# Kraemer ASB Leadership Class Overview

*The Kraemer ASB Leadership Program is an eighth grade elective class that serves the school as the student council, providing representation and activities for the entire student body. The program instructs students on planning techniques, decision-making skills, problem solving, organizational skills, group dynamics, principles of communication, budgeting and issues of public relations. It focuses on skill building, planning, implementation evaluation and experiential learning for the purpose of growing the individual students in the areas of respect, responsibility, service and initiative. An outgrowth of the program is the promotion and enhancement of a positive school climate.*

*Responsibilities include planning lunch time activities, dances, fundraising, recognition programs, special events and helping with the various programs of the school. Students selected to the program must be willing to give up portions of their time to serve the other students of the school.*

want to create  
want to express themselves and be heard.  
need a variety of learning opportunities.  
need time to reflect.  
learn from each other.  
need time to debrief at the end of projects.  
develop best when they are supported by peers.

### Realize that . . .

a room full of students is a room full of different learning styles.  
challenge is a good thing.  
learning is not always comfortable.  
Students begin the process at different places; intellectually, experientially and emotionally.  
For true learning to take place students go through the process, not just get to the end point.
